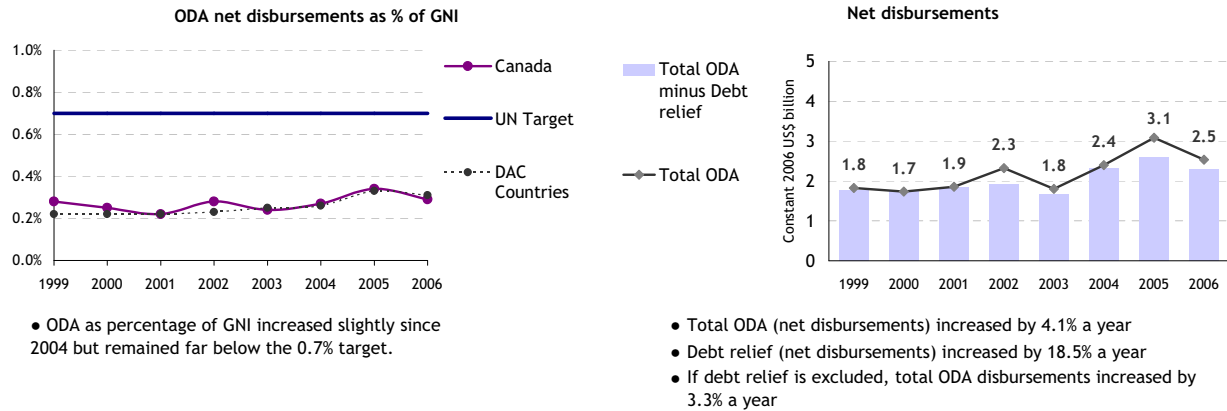


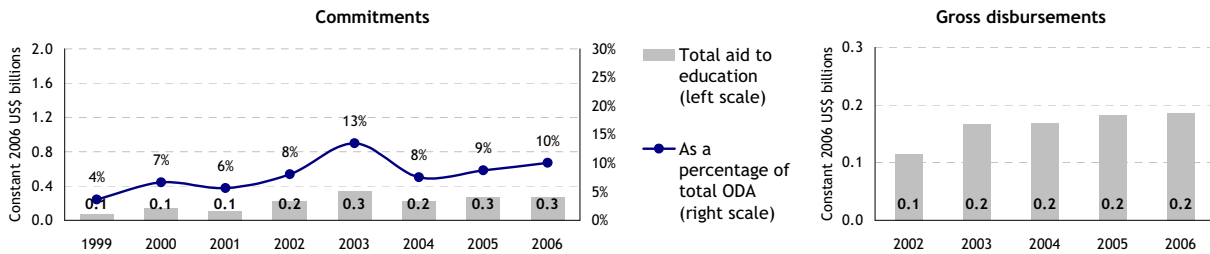

► Total aid to education, changes since Dakar



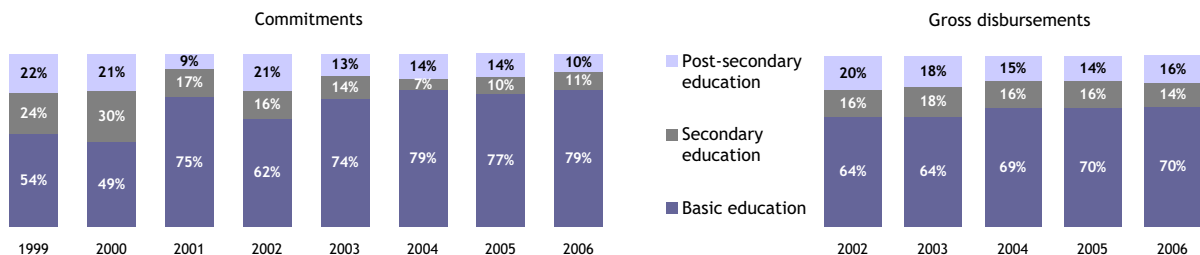
Commitments:

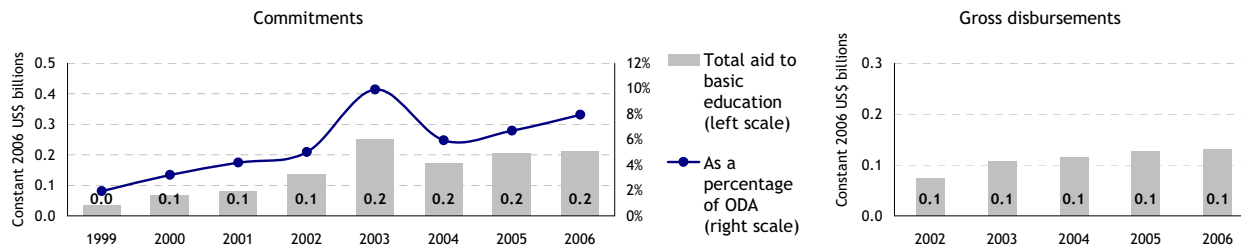

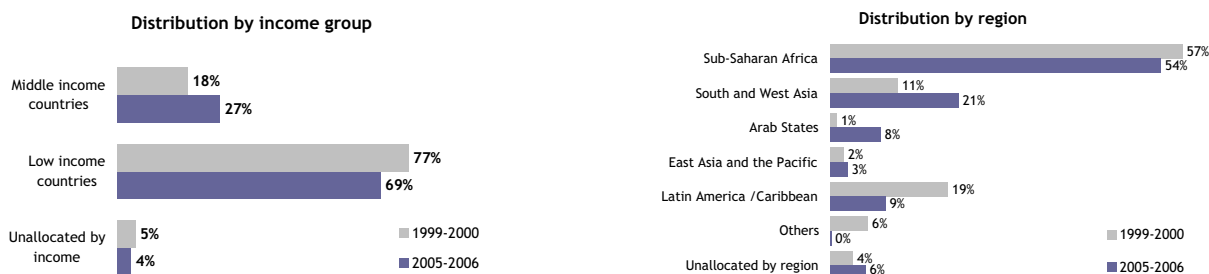

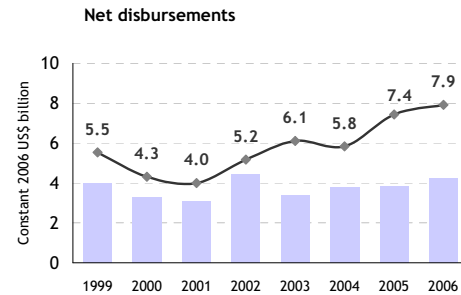

Total ODA



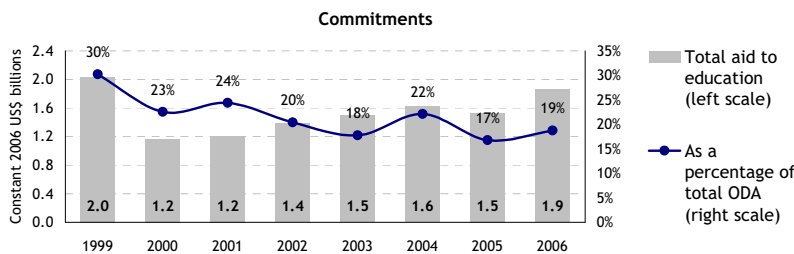

- If debt relief is excluded, total ODA disbursements increased by 0.8% a year

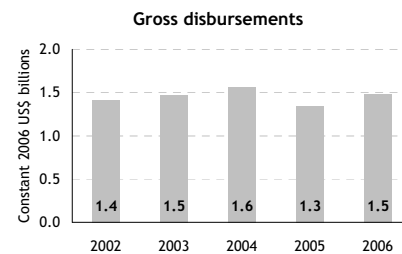
French aid to education

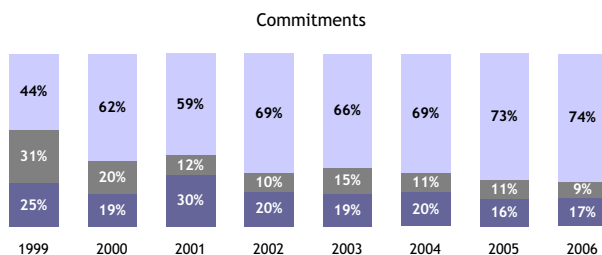

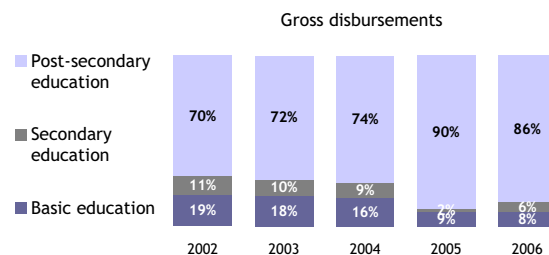

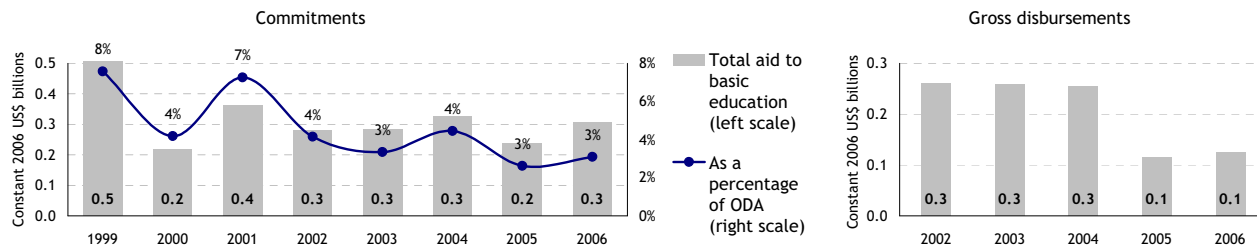

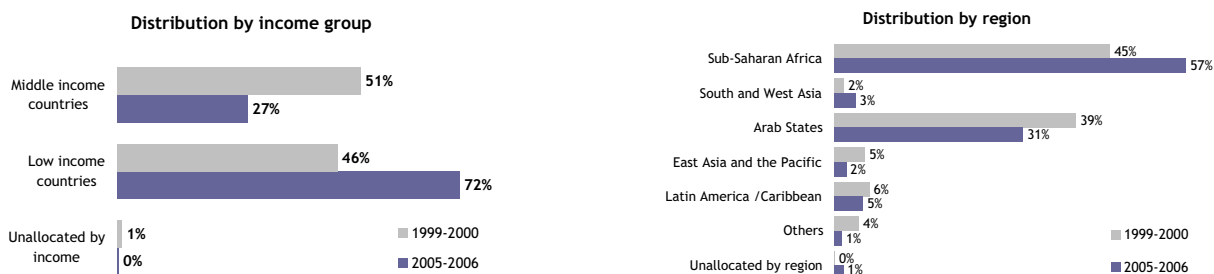

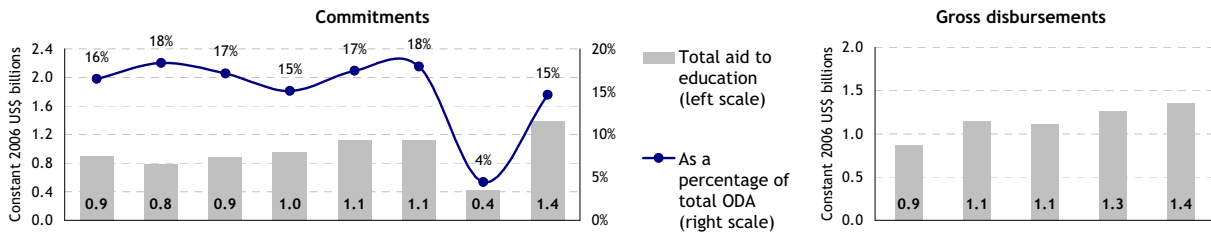
Overview of German aid to education 1999-2006

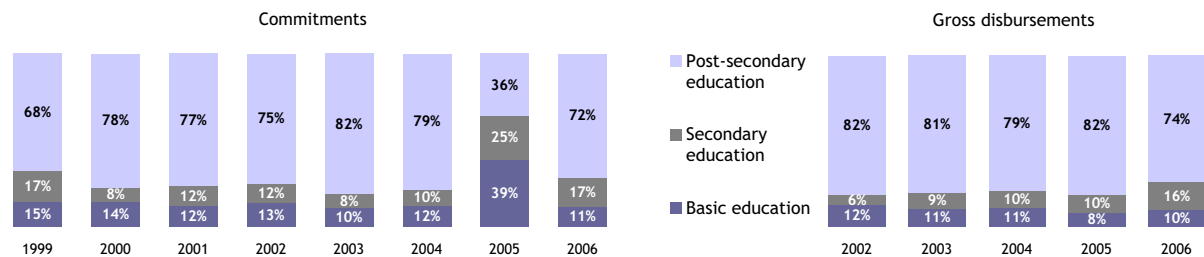

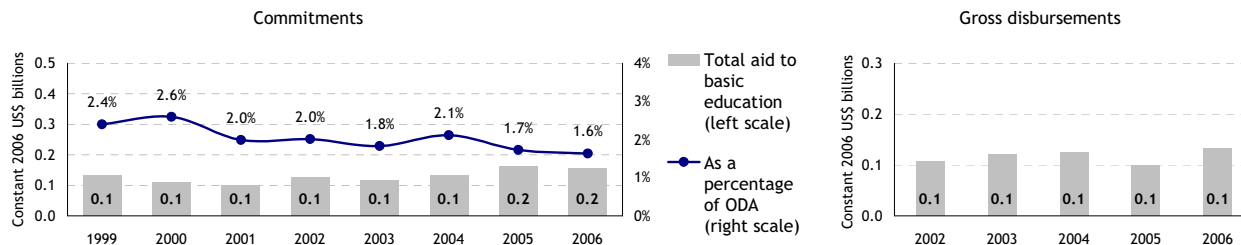

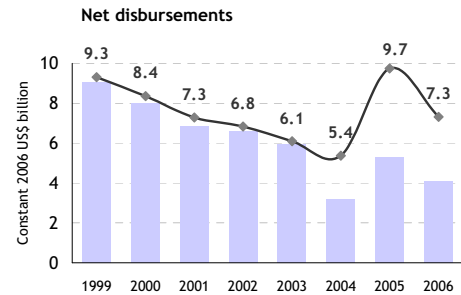

Total ODA



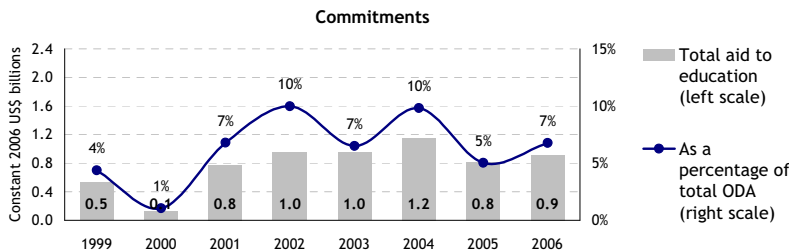

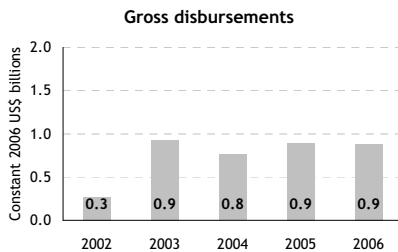

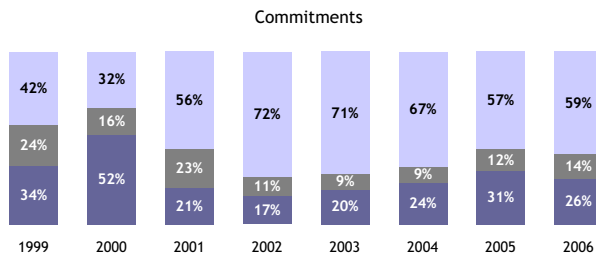

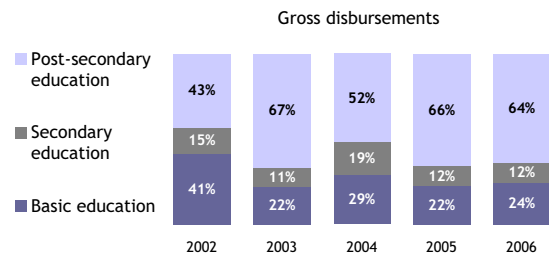

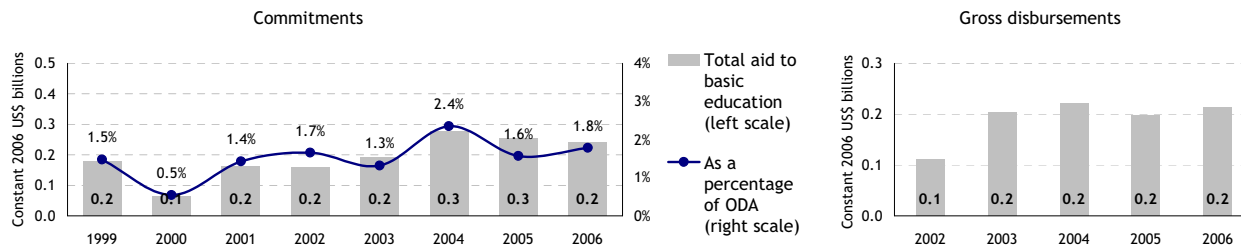

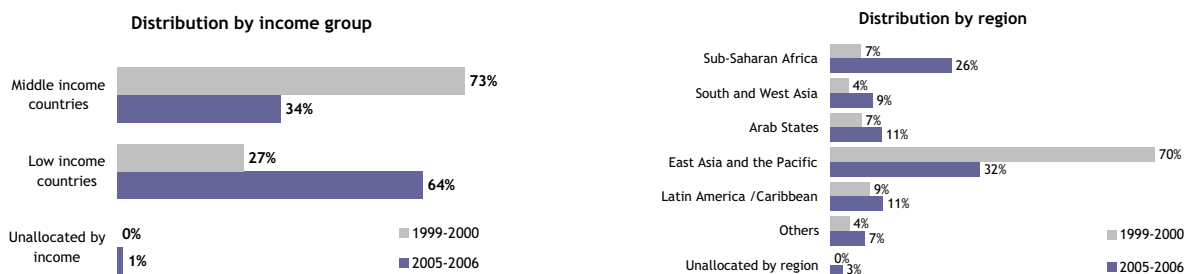

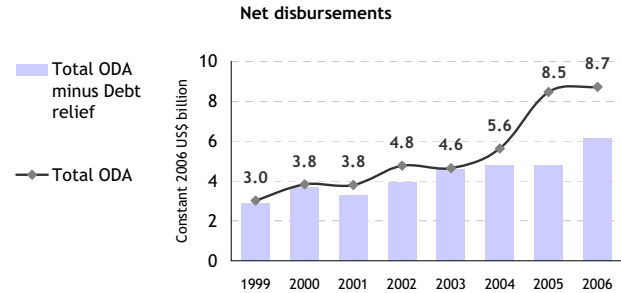

Total ODA



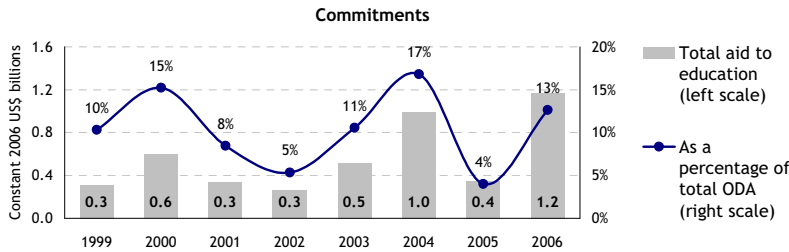

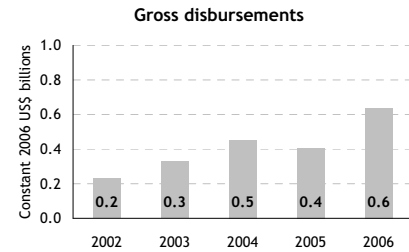

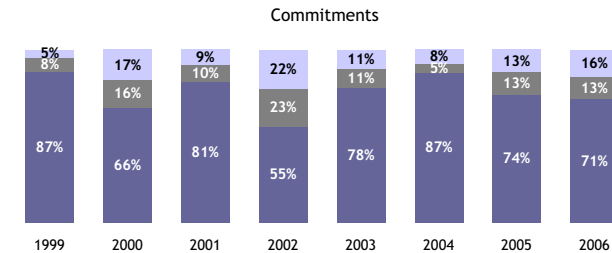

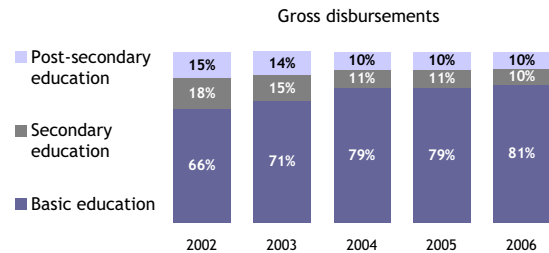

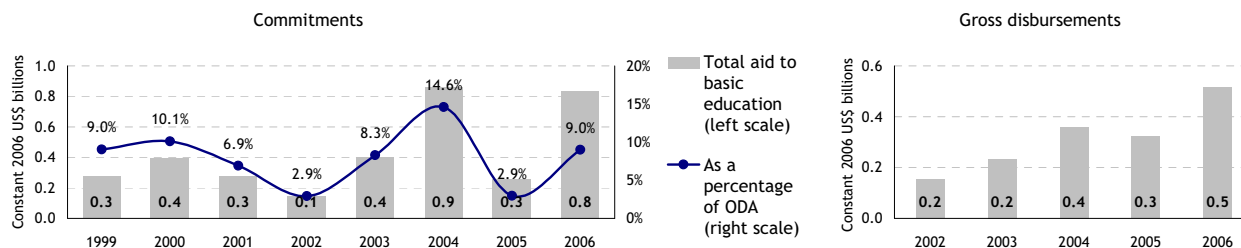

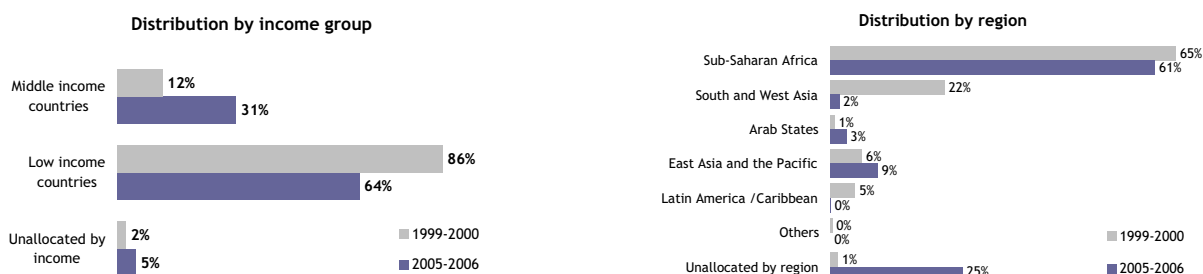

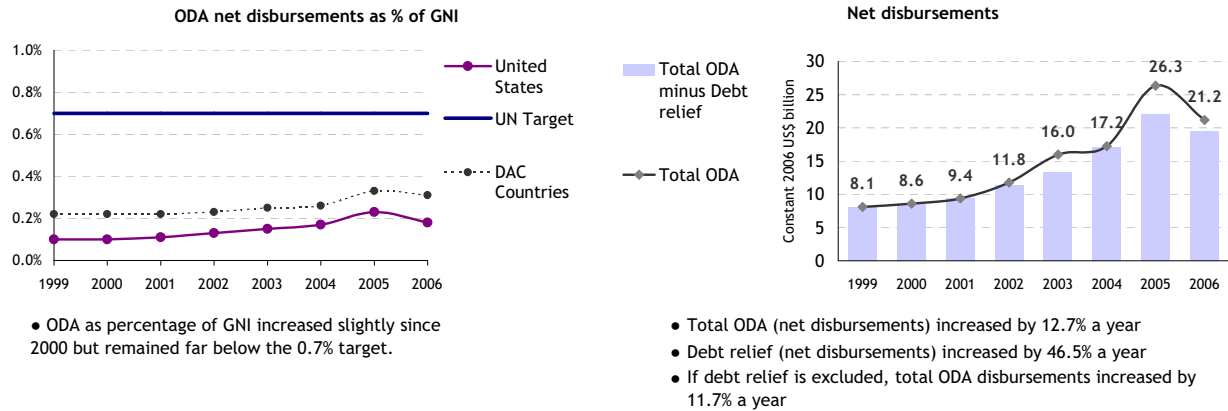

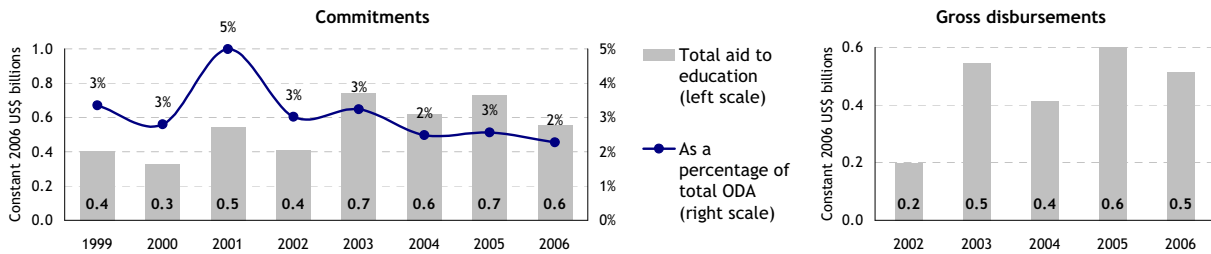
Overview of United States aid to education 1999-2006

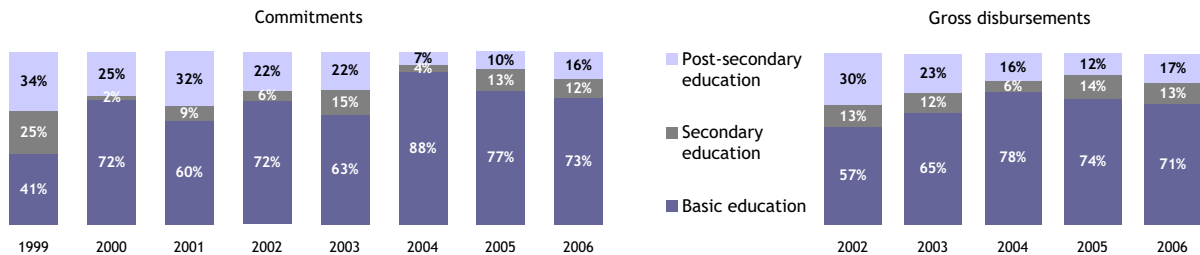

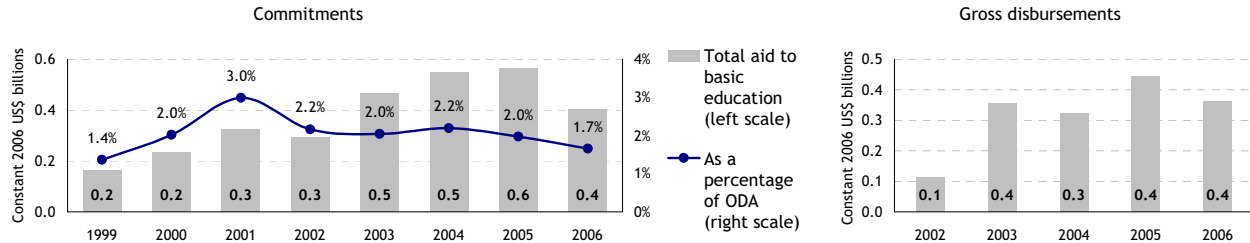

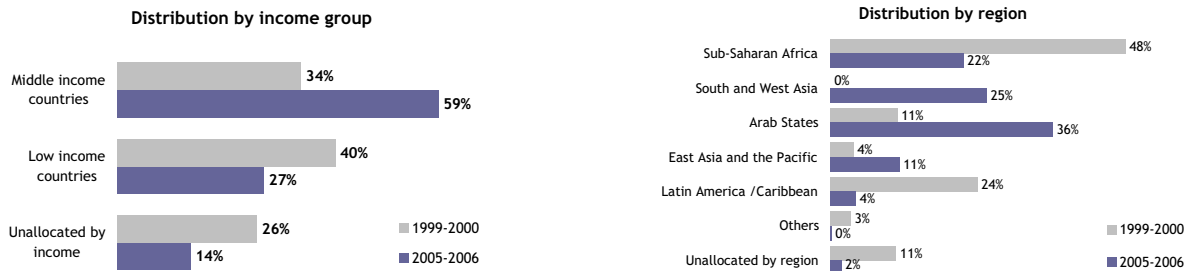
