Subject: International Year for the Rapprochement of Cultures (2010)

Sir/Madam,

Pursuant to circular letter CL/3880 which was sent to you on 15 May 2009, I should like to consult you further on the leading role that UNESCO will be required to play in the context of the celebration of the International Year for the Rapprochement of Cultures in 2010, in accordance with United Nations General Assembly resolution 63/22.

The General Conference, at its 35th session, approved the preliminary action plan for the International Year and invited the Director-General to finalize the Plan and "to pursue his efforts to build awareness among all partners and to mobilize extrabudgetary funding in order to attain the goals of the International Year for the Rapprochement of Cultures".

The main objective of the Year, set out in the enclosed leaflet, is to celebrate the world's cultural diversity and help strengthen dialogue among cultures. As I stressed at the time of taking office as Director-General of UNESCO, the challenges posed by the unprecedented economic, social and environmental crises of recent years heighten the need for informed debate, dialogue and exchange among the peoples of our world. Such dialogue is key to the building and maintenance of peace inherent in my vision of a new humanism for the twenty-first century. I want to ensure that UNESCO's leadership of the Year facilitates an in-depth reflection on tolerance, reconciliation and balance in our societies.

I therefore very much welcome the suggestions for the Year that I have already received. They have been grouped into four major themes, contained in document 35 C/55 which is available on the UNESCO website. These themes are:

- (i) promoting reciprocal knowledge of cultural, ethnic, linguistic and religious diversity;
- (ii) building a framework for commonly shared values;
- (iii) strengthening quality education and the building of intercultural competences;
- (iv) fostering dialogue for sustainable development.

We have also taken full cognizance of the activities that are planned by the Member States. These are of various kinds:

- (a) greater opportunities for research, meetings and public debates and broadening of the spaces for intercultural mediation, and making use of new technologies, in particular to foster linguistic diversity and translation;
- (b) promotion of the role of creativity in cultural diversity and enhancement of both the specific characteristics of cultures and their similarities;
- (c) strengthening of the role of formal and non-formal education, research, the media and new information technologies so as to disseminate diversified educational, cultural and scientific contents more widely, thereby correcting erroneous cultural representations, values and stereotypes.

I also welcome the large number of practical actions that have already been planned by Member States and by various partners, including the Alliance of Civilizations, and would like to take this opportunity to call upon National Commissions for UNESCO, agencies of the United Nations system, governmental and non-governmental organizations, UNITWIN/UNESCO Chairs and Associated Schools, Goodwill Ambassadors, Artists for Peace, UNESCO Clubs and Centres, as well as parliamentarians, locally elected officials, the world of culture, the sciences, education and the media and youth organizations to participate actively in this Year.

I should be grateful if you would give high visibility to the activities that will be carried out as part of the celebration of this Year so as to ensure the greatest possible impact at the local, national and regional levels. In this respect, I am pleased to inform you that the logo for the Year 2010 is available upon request from the Secretariat.

All replies received and the new proposals submitted throughout the Year will be available on UNESCO's website (www.unesco.org/culture/dialogue), set up specifically for this occasion. All new initiatives will be gradually used to create a database of good practices for intercultural dialogue.
