

Gender Disaggregated Indicators For Water

Monitoring Assessment And Reporting

Gender-disaggregated data is always a considerable gap in water reports and a need for the collection and production of these type of information has been addressed and stressed in several occasions by UNESCO Director General.

This side-event will present the preliminary results of the WWAP Working Group on Gender-Disaggregated Indicators. The group is a joint effort of different entities working on the development of a few significant gender-sensitive water indicators and a consolidated methodology. The event will benefit from the presentations and insights on gender and water issues from AMCOW, the National Water Research Commission of South Africa, SIWI, Women for Water Partnership.

The main aim of this event is providing specific tools and practical guidelines for the use of gender-disaggregation technique in future assessment monitoring and reporting mechanisms, to be disseminated among partners and stakeholders. The event will present case studies and different perspectives on the challenges, difficulties and perspectives on the use of gender-disaggregated indicators from the point of view of main stakeholders and final users, such as NGOs, National and International Monitoring Institutions, think tanks. The outcomes of this joint cooperation will inform the debate on the post-2015 development agenda and goals.
