- 4. <u>Further takes note</u> that additional support and efforts are needed to ensure the monitoring and evaluation of programmes implemented under the Convention in order to sustain their results and impacts;
- 5. <u>Thanks</u> the Member States and other entities that have supported the implementation of the Convention through various funding modalities, including funds-in-trust, voluntary contributions, and contributions to the International Fund for Cultural Diversity;
- 6. <u>Encourages</u> Parties to make additional contributions, in particular to support the implementation of the following strategic priorities: preferential treatment, the implementation of the Convention in the digital environment, the status of the artist, and the two global priorities of UNESCO Africa and gender equality as well as its two Priority Groups Small Island Developing States and Youth in the cultural and creative industries;
- 7. <u>Invites</u> Parties to strengthen the human resources of the Secretariat to support the implementation of the Convention through the appointment of associate experts or the secondment of staff, particularly in the areas of knowledge production and management, communication, resource mobilisation, and project monitoring and evaluation;
- 8. <u>Further invites</u> the Secretariat and Parties to pay particular attention to the provisions of the Declaration of MONDIACULT 2022 to enhance the implementation of the Convention;

 <u>Requests</u> the Secretariat to submit to it, at its seventeenth session, a report on its activities undertaken in 2023, taking into account the discussions held during the current session.

Item 5 of the Agenda: Transmission of new quadrennial periodic reports and proposals to rationalize their submission cycles

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> document DCE/23/16.IGC/5 and its Annex,
- 2. <u>Recalling</u> Resolutions 4.CP 10, 5.CP 9a, 6.CP 9, 7.CP 11 and 8.CP 9 of the Conference of Parties and its Decisions 8.IGC 7a, 8.IGC 7b, 9.IGC 10, 10.IGC 9, 11.IGC 8, 12.IGC 7, 12.IGC 13, 13.IGC 6, 14.IGC 6, and 15.IGC 5,
- 3. <u>Further recalling</u> paragraph 4 of the Operational Guidelines related to Article 9 of the Convention on "Information Sharing and Transparency," which reminds Parties to ensure that the reports are written in language consistent with the United Nations Charter and the 2005 Convention with a view to encourage dialogue and mutual respect among Parties,
- 4. <u>Takes note</u> of the executive summaries of the quadrennial periodic reports on the implementation of the Convention, submitted by Parties in 2022, presented in the Annex to this document and <u>congratulates</u> Parties that submitted their report in a timely manner;
- 5. <u>Requests</u> the Secretariat to transmit to the Conference of Parties, at its ninth session, the quadrennial periodic reports examined by the Committee at this session, together with its comments;
- 6. <u>Invites</u> Parties whose reports are due in 2023 to submit them to the Secretariat no later than 30 June 2023, if possible in both working languages of the Committee, as well as in other languages, using the dedicated electronic form, and <u>encourages</u> the Parties whose reports were due in 2022 and that have not yet been submitted to submit them by the same date;
- 7. <u>Welcomes</u> the concrete support offered to Small Island Developing States in the elaboration of their quadrennial periodic reports in the framework of the International Fund for Cultural Diversity and through programmes supported by voluntary contributions in 2022, <u>further encourages</u> the States that benefitted from this support to report on their experience and the usefulness of the support they received, and <u>further requests</u> the Secretariat to continue this support in 2023;
- 8. <u>Further takes note</u> of the two proposals concerning the rationalization of the periodic reporting cycle with a view to ensuring the efficient and sustainable monitoring of the Convention and the streamlining of reporting deadlines, and <u>also requests</u> the Secretariat to transmit to the ninth session of the Conference of Parties, for its approval, the following recommended proposal: Option 2 "Single global submission date," bearing in mind the importance and the necessity of preparation and capacity building at the regional level;
- 9. <u>Also encourages</u> Parties to provide voluntary contributions to upscale the Secretariat's capacity-building programme on participatory policy monitoring and for the implementation and improvement of the Convention's Knowledge Management System, in particular its Policy Monitoring Platform.

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> document DCE/23/16.IGC/6 and its Annexes, as well as documents DCE/23/16.IGC/INF.6 and DCE/23/16.IGC/INF.6 Add.,
- 2. <u>Takes note</u> of the financial report of the International Fund for Cultural Diversity (IFCD) for the period 1 January to 30 November 2022 contained in document DCE/23/16.IGC/INF.6 as well as for the period 1 January to 31 December 2023 contained in document DCE/23/16.IGC/INF.6 Add.;
- 3. <u>Expresses its sincere appreciation</u> to all Parties that have contributed on a voluntary basis to the IFCD, in particular those Parties that have increased the level of their voluntary contributions or made contributions for the first time, and <u>thanks</u> the private entities that made a donation to the IFCD, spearheading the IFCD outreach to the private sector;
- 4. <u>Notes with appreciation</u> the fundraising efforts made by the Secretariat and various IFCD stakeholders, which resulted in a promising increase in the number of donors making contribution to the IFCD;
- 5. <u>Recalls</u> the commitment of Parties to make voluntary contributions on a regular basis to the IFCD for the implementation of the Convention, in accordance with its Article 18.7, and <u>encourages</u> all Parties to support it on a regular basis by making an annual contribution equal to or greater than 1% of their contribution to UNESCO's regular budget;
- 6. <u>Requests</u> the Director-General to issue in 2023 a new call for voluntary contributions to all Parties to the Convention, quoting the amount corresponding to 1% of the total contribution of each Member State to UNESCO's regular budget;
- 7. <u>Further requests</u> the Secretariat to communicate the amount of voluntary contributions for 2023 as an indicative amount to those Parties requiring anticipated budgetary information in order to request a budget allocation for the IFCD voluntary contribution within their 2024 state budget;
- 8. <u>Invites</u> all Parties to support the implementation of the IFCD communication and fundraising strategy (2021-2023) by proposing High-Net-Worth-Individuals or private companies that may be interested in partnering with UNESCO for the IFCD;
- 9. <u>Also requests</u> the Secretariat to make the necessary adjustments to the implementation modalities of the IFCD communication and fundraising strategy (2021-2023), particularly with regard to resource mobilization vis-à-vis the private sector and High-Net-Worth-Individuals, as well as to reinforce the monitoring and evaluation of the funded projects and foster peer-to-peer learning among IFCD stakeholders;
- 10. <u>Requests</u> the Secretariat to submit to it, at its seventeenth session, a narrative and financial report for the IFCD covering the period 1 January to 30 November 2023, as well as a draft provisional budget for 2024-2025 taking into account the need to finance the third external evaluation of the IFCD including the evaluation of the results of the IFCD communication and fundraising strategy (2021-2023), to reinforce the monitoring and evaluation of IFCD-funded projects, as well as to provide customized training and technical assistance support for Small Island Developing States and other priority countries, such as Least Developed Countries.

Item 7 of the Agenda: Recommended projects from the thirteenth call for funding requests to the International Fund for Cultural Diversity

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> document DCE/23/16.IGC/7 and its Annexes,
- 2. <u>Regrets</u> the lack of funding necessary to cover all the projects that could potentially be selected;
- 3. <u>Takes note</u> of the efforts of the Secretariat to strengthen the capacities of the various stakeholders involved in the preparation and pre-selection of funding requests, as well as the need to reinforce the monitoring and evaluation of funded projects and networking activities;
- 4. <u>Thanks</u> the National Commissions for UNESCO that have completed the pre-selection process and <u>encourages</u> all concerned National Commissions for UNESCO to engage in the pre-selection process in future;
- 5. <u>Further thanks</u> all Parties that have made voluntary contributions to the International Fund for Cultural Diversity in 2022, which provides increased support to project funding, and <u>further encourages</u> all Parties to further support the IFCD by making an annual contribution equal to or greater than 1% of their contribution to UNESCO's regular budget;
- 6. <u>Expresses its appreciation</u> to the Panel of Experts for its important work, <u>further takes</u> <u>note</u> of its evaluation comments regarding the projects recommended for financing by the IFCD, and <u>requests</u> the Secretariat to implement the recommendations made by the Panel of Experts to the extent possible and within the limit of available resources;
- 7. <u>Decides</u> that the eleven projects amounting to US\$897,213 presented in Annex I and attached to this decision will receive financial support from the IFCD;
- 8. <u>Further decides</u> to issue the fourteenth call for funding requests in 2023;
- 9. <u>Further requests</u> the Secretariat to take into account the exchanges held during this session on the necessity of capacity building and on the importance of equitable geographical distribution in the selection of projects.

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> document DCE/23/16.IGC/8 and information document DCE/23/16.IGC/INF.8,
- 2. <u>Recalling</u> its Decisions 15.IGC 9 and 14.IGC 16 as well as Resolution 8.CP 13 of the Conference of Parties,
- 3. <u>Takes note</u> of the results of the consultations of UNESCO networks and the proposals that aim to improve the Committee's consultations with micro, small, and mediumsized cultural and creative enterprises within the framework of existing mechanisms;
- 4. <u>Reaffirms the importance</u> of undertaking regular consultations with micro, small, and medium-sized cultural and creative enterprises in order to enable them to play a role as key players in the cultural and creative industries and therefore contribute to the achievement of the objectives of the Convention on the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions;

Item 10 of the Agenda: Collaboration with civil society to implement the Convention and proposals for the organization of the fourth Forum

The Committee,

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> document DCE/23/16.IGC/10 and its Annexes,
- 2. <u>Recalling</u> its Decisions 1.IGC 5c, 1.EXT.IGC 5, 5.IGC 4, 8.IGC 7a, 9.IGC 9, 10.IGC 6, 11.IGC 6, 11.IGC 10, 13.IGC 10, 14.IGC 15 and 15.IGC 11 as well as the Resolutions of the Conference of Parties 2.CP 7, 4.CP 13, 6.CP 12, 7.CP 14 and 8.CP 13,
- 3. <u>Reiterates its commitment</u> to the fundamental role of civil society in the protection and the promotion of the diversity of cultural expressions in line with Article 11 of the Convention, since civil society provides the expertise that is needed to guarantee an inclusive, efficient, and human-rights based implementation of the Convention;
- 4. <u>Regrets</u> that the online exchange session with civil society organizations did not take place and <u>requests</u> the Secretariat to organize it at a later date;
- 5. <u>Further requests</u> the Secretariat to consult civil society actors to ensure their continued participation in the work of the governing bodies of the Convention;
- 6. <u>Thanks</u> the Secretariat for the steps undertaken to optimize the admission process of civil society organizations to the meetings of the governing bodies and <u>also requests</u> the Secretariat to continue optimizing the admission process in accordance with the Operational Guidelines related to Article 11 on the "Role and participation of civil society";
- 7. <u>Takes note with satisfaction</u> of the launch of the open call for civil society written contributions in 2022 as well as of the analytical summary of the contributions received, and <u>further thanks</u> the organizations that have participated in this process;
- 8. <u>Takes note</u> of the low submission rate of written contributions having been received from organizations based in Latin America and the Caribbean, as well as in the Arab States region, and <u>requests</u> the Secretariat to take steps to address this imbalance, which is due in part to language barriers;
- 9. <u>Further takes note</u> of the preliminary proposals for the organization of the fourth edition of the Civil Society Forum (2023) following the consultations that were carried out;
- 10. <u>Further requests</u> the Secretariat to launch a call for volunteers amongst civil society organizations that have requested to participate in the meetings of the governing bodies and <u>invites</u> it to work in close cooperation with those that respond to the call for volunteers in order to prepare and organise the fourth edition of the Civil Society Forum.
