African Union Continental Teacher Award Ceremony 2023 and Webinar on "Investing in Our Teacher: Professional Standards and Competencies, Working Conditions, and Teacher Education"

Teacher Development is one of the key strategic objectives of the Continental Education Strategy for Africa (CESA 16-25). The webinar will include (i) introductory remarks; (ii) a brief presentation of a report on professional standards, teacher education, and working conditions; and (iii) the award ceremony for the winners of the Continental Teacher Award.

Roundtable on teacher policies at the 2nd KIX Continental Symposium on Educational Research in Africa (3-5 October 2023, in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire).

The day will include a session with teachers' voices, a presentation by Dr. Christian Addai-Poku, Secretary General of AFTRA, Chief Executive of the National Teaching Council of Ghana, and President of Education International, and other speakers. This will be followed by a roundtable on professional standards and competencies, teacher education, and working conditions.

The KIX Symposium is jointly organised by the KIX Africa 19 Hub whose Secretariat is managed by IICBA and the KIX Africa 21 Hub.

- The UNESCO International Institute for Capacity Building in Africa (IICBA) will release several studies for Teachers' Day, including "West Africa Investing in Teachers and School Leaders: Professional Standards, Teacher Education, and Working Conditions." The study investigates the state of professional standards and competencies for teachers and school leaders in West Africa against the backdrop of guidance from instruments developed by UNESCO, Education International, and the African Union Commission. It considers: (1) the national frameworks of professional standards and competencies and their implementation; (2) teacher education, both pre-service and in-service; and (3) the working conditions of teachers and school leaders. In addition to analysis across West African countries, more detailed analysis is also conducted for Sierra Leone and The Gambia to illustrate differences between countries in approaches and policies.

Topics covered include the motivation and quality of teaching, quality and relevance of initial and in-service training, improving teacher management and governance, and teacher recruitment.
